On May 15, 2025, we experienced the sudden and unexpected passing of our beloved Cooper Dermatology and HMGS colleague, **Robert F. Duffy**, **MD**.

Dr. Duffy (who liked to be called Robby) graduated with honors from Cooper Medical School of Rowan University in 2019. He completed his medical internship at Cooper, followed by his dermatology residency at Cooper, and a subsequent fellowship in pediatric dermatology at the Children's Hospital of Philadelphia. We were delighted when Dr. Duffy decided to join our practice in August 2024 and become an Assistant Professor of Medicine (Dermatology) at Cooper.

Dr. Duffy was a brilliant, kind, compassionate, and dedicated physician. His patients and colleagues adored him because of his jovial demeanor, genuine warmth, and desire to deliver the best care possible. His exuberant joy of life made him special, with a passion for travel and culinary delights. His inquisitiveness knew no bounds, always striving for new knowledge, whether in dermatology, cooking, hiking, yoga, or learning a new language. What is your fondest memory of Cooper Dermatology?

One of the most meaningful aspects of my time at Cooper Dermatology was the deep connection between residents and faculty. As part of a smaller program, we had the privilege of extensive one-on-one learning with attendings who were not only extremely knowledgeable and ethical but also deeply committed to our growth. Words of advice to current dermatology residents:

Soak up every ounce of wisdom from your attendings—they truly are living legends. The first year it will seem very overwhelming but somehow it all starts to come together in the second year. Try to learn about billing and the business side of medicine. It'll serve you well in the long run. And if you get the chance- apply for the AAD International Resident Grant to spend time learning and practicing dermatology abroad- it is truly life changing. But regardless of how much you accomplish, it's a well-accepted fact: Pascal will always be the favorite resident. Some legacies are simply untouchable.

Words of advice to recent graduates:

Have Dr. Heymann on speed dial! It's completely normal and healthy to feel humbled during your first year out of training. Lean on more experienced colleagues and remember that learning is a lifetime practice. You're not expected to know everything, but trust that you have been well trained and have an incredible network to lean on. Stay curious and current with the literature, but also give yourself permission to enjoy a healthy work-life balance. Take that vacation, make time for loved ones, and find hobbies outside of medicine.

Favorite clinical pearl:

Switching to the painless PDT protocol—an easy, well-tolerated treatment that patients overwhelmingly prefer to topical alternatives.
